
AniMeals Program

We know that pets are part of the family, so GSC Meals on Wheels makes sure we provide for two and four legged participants so everyone stays healthy and happy. **AniMeals** is a donation-sustained service, which provides weekly deliveries of pet food, litter, treats and toys to clients who find it hard to maintain the nutrition of their companion animals. We realized that many of our seniors were sacrificing their own nutrition and giving their meals to their pets. This program makes sure that everyone eats and has the nutrition to keep them happy and healthy.

We've connected seniors with similar interests to send cards and letters to each other. The best part is there is no postage involved. Our regular drivers deliver the letters when they bring meals.

From Our Executive Director

As the dawn of a new year approaches, I think it is appropriate for us as an organization to look back on all the challenges we overcame in 2020 and celebrate the volunteers, donors, and community partners that made it possible. In fact, I can say with 100% certitude that Greater Spokane County Meals on Wheels is exiting the year 2020 as a stronger and more resilient organization. This is excellent news as long before COVID-19 came to visit us, we knew that we were facing a monumental challenge with the projected rise in the senior population that is looming over the next 10 years.

That is to partner with local businesses and like-minded nonprofits so that the solution to senior hunger and isolation is a community solution. With great appreciation, we receive the benevolence and generosity of private donors and steward those funds well to make a lasting impact over the decades to come. At the end of the day, we are one generation of Spokane County citizens taking care of another. People helping other people is how we made it through 2020 and I have a suspicion that's how we'll make it through the decade to come as well.
